Add other fun things, hygiene items, school stuff etc.** "Dollar Store" has: **TOYS:** cars, jump ropes, balls, light-up toys w/batteries. plastic figurines. **School:** pencils, crayons, markers, notebooks, picture books(no words). **Hygiene:** toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths. **Accessories:** t-shirts, hats, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlight etc.
